## [2022/2023 Kindergarten registration now open](#)

Kindergarten registration for the 2022/23 school year is now open. Children who turn 5 by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 are eligible to register. Also required is the child's birth certificate, MSP carecard, proof of residence (ie utility bill, passport, driver's license) and up-to-date immunization records.
