### Learning

- 5. National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Assembly On September 29th, Canyon-Lister marked the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Students learned about Residential School survivors, reflected on the importance of Orange Shirt Day, and heard from Ms. Danforth's class about Indigenous leaders like Justice Murray Sinclair. The assembly emphasized that reconciliation is about remembering the past and choosing to live today with respect, kindness, and a commitment to justice.
- 6. <u>Terry Fox Run</u> On September 23rd, Canyon-Lister students participated in the annual Terry Fox Run, with Grades 1–7 walking or running to the park and Kindergarten students taking part on school grounds. Together, students raised \$297 for cancer research, with a special mention to Callum in Miss Adams' class, who raised an impressive \$1,017 on his own. It was a meaningful way to honor Terry Fox's legacy of courage and determination.
